Program description

Twelve-week, 192-hour dispatcher course combines classroom and hands-on dispatch training. Practice handling single and multiple simulated calls with scenarios in law, fire and EMS using a 911 dispatch software.

The course is designed to prepare U.S.-based students to take a national exam that leads to job placement. The course does not meet the criteria for either the student or visitor visa rules with regard to studying.
