The Associate of Arts degree with a concentration in Theatre is based on the Ohio Guaranteed Transfer Pathway in Theatre. It is recommended for students planning to start at Tri-C and transfer to a four-year institution to major in Theatre Arts (Performance, Production, or Theatre Management).

The Theatre Arts program at Cuyahoga Community College (Tri-C®) can help students explore their interest in acting and stagecraft as an avocation, or it can set the stage for a career in theatrical performance, production, management and more.

Through studies in acting, stage management, and technical Theatre, Tri-C Theatre Arts students will build a solid base for transferring to a four-year institution for a bachelor's degree in performance or Theatre technology.

Students in this program have access to seven different Theatre facilities across three Tri-C campuses. The facilities provide students with an opportunity to practice stagecraft and acting by putting on quality productions for Theatre lovers.

Program Learning Outcomes

This program is designed to prepare students to demonstrate the following learning outcomes:

- a. Utilize the basic tools of acting: Body movement, vocal production, and imagination to perform in a College Theater Production.
- b. Perform scene and prop construction, set up stage rigging and lighting, and utilize the applications of audio in accordance with the principles and practices of technical theatre, costuming, makeup, and stage management

- c. Use script analysis techniques when reading a script and envision it in production either through directing, acting or designing.
- d. Perform backstage or design duties as required by the director or technical director.
- e. Communicate effectively in spoken and written English, for an intended audience, using clear, organized language.
- f. Use critical thinking skills to analyze situations, adapt to changes, and resolve problems.
- g. Be prepared for transfer to four-year Bachelor of Arts program in Theatre.

Foreign Language Requirement

The majority of schools require at least 6-8 credits of foreign language at the College level to complete a Bachelor of Arts in Theatre; however, the Foreign Language requirement varies from institution to institution and may depend on how many foreign language courses you took at the high school level. For this reason, you should check with your intended transfer institution to determine how many foreign language credits are required for your intended transfer program and plan accordingly. To fulfill foreign language requirements, you should select from the below Transfer Assurance Guide approved foreign language courses. If your intended program of study doesn't require foreign language or you have fulfilled the requirement based on coursework taken in high school, you may select other appropriate Ohio Transfer 36 or Transfer Assurance Guide approved courses as electives, in place of the foreign language requirement. MATH-1140, MATH-1141, MATH-1200, MATH-1270, and MATH-1280 can no longer count towards fulfilling the college-level mathematics requirement. These courses were re-classified as developmental mathematics by the state of Ohio in 2016. Tri-C established a 5-year transitioning window for students who had completed these courses prior to 2016 to apply them towards meeting graduation requirements, which expired in Summer 2021. It is highly recommended to see a counselor to determine the appropriate math required for your current major.
